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Fourth All-Time! Trek Raises \$1.628M

Largest participation since COVID

This year saw the largest participation since COVID with 255 people across 109 vehicles.

The scale of the event reflects not only the growing enthusiasm of our motoring community but also the incredible work behind the scenes—from route planning and supplier coordination to participant support and fundraising.

It's been a powerful reminder of what we can achieve together.

Communications and Media

Media engagement was a strong feature of this year's trek, with every town we visited receiving coverage from local outlets and several following the journey from start to finish.

Trekkers were supported with tips and advice on how to promote themselves to both media and on social platforms, which helped amplify their stories and fundraising efforts.

Many appreciated being contacted by the RFDS ahead of the trek to help shape personal stories that connected their journey to the cause.

Social media activity throughout the event was especially engaging and well-received by both Trekkers and their supporters, helping to build momentum and community spirit across the entire trek.

In Summary

In our view, the 2025 Outback Car Trek was an outstanding success. The transition from Bill Patrick to RFDS South Eastern Section ensures continuity and confidence across the board.

Fundraising efforts were exceptional, with this year's total ranking as the fourth highest in Trek history. Comms and media coverage were strong from start to finish, helping to amplify the impact of the event and the stories of our Trekkers.

Importantly, the trek ran smoothly with no major injuries, medical issues, or vehicle breakdowns—a testament to the outstanding work of our volunteer official team. The final breakfast following the closing dinner was well attended, with around 90–100 participants gathering to celebrate the journey. An amazing Trek all round.

Top 4 Highest Donations

We're proud to share that this year's trek raised an incredible **\$1.628M**, making it the fourth highest total in Trek history.

This achievement is a testament to the creativity and commitment of our Trekkers, who fundraised through events, sponsorships, and the generous support of family and friends.

Notably, we saw a jump in Raisely page setups, from 29 last year to 41 this year, which aided in boosting donations.

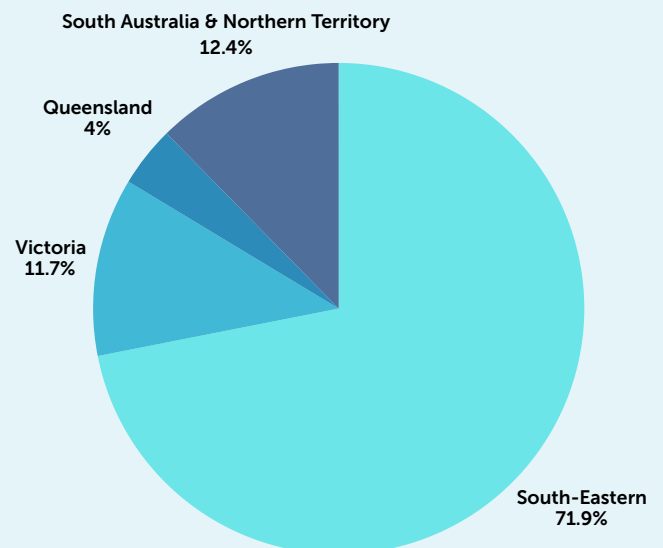
Auctions and team raffles also proved to be effective fundraising avenues, and we're excited to build on these successes in future treks.

Community Benefits

In addition to raising funds to deliver services, the trekkers also provide a significant economic boost to the communities they pass through, with an average of \$75,000 spent per day over the course of the trek.

This doesn't include fundraising efforts to support local causes, with nearly \$19,000 spent on school raffles during the ten-day event.

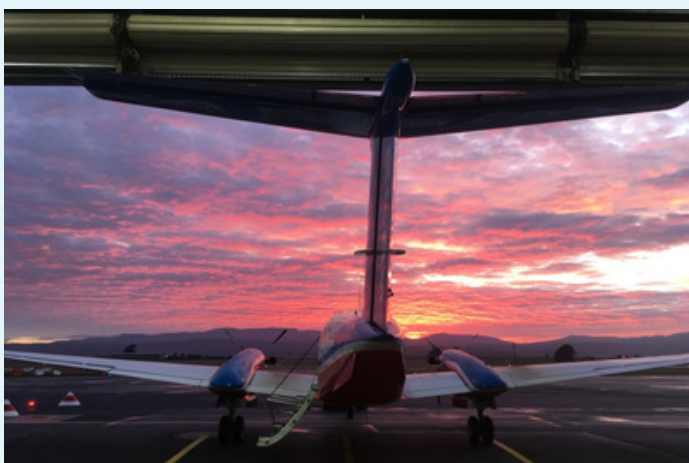
6 June 2026 Launceston, TAS
