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**BREAKFAST & BRIEFING IN BATHURST** is in the Windereyne Room, which is directly above the start/finish line in Pitt Straight. You enter the complex from Conrod Straight, turning right directly opposite the exit from Rydges car park. No earlier than 07:00 please, breakfast finishes and the briefing starts at 08:30, first car leaves at 09:15.

**ALL SUPPORTS MUST** leave at the end of the field from Bathurst on Friday morning; Trek cars leave first. Please save the officials the task of turning you around - all supports leave at the end of the field.

WHEN YOU LEAVE DUBBO you will have the chance to purchase your ticket to the Antipasto & Roachtail night in Quilpie. The Baby Cockroaches will be working the outwards queue with their little tap & go machine, but they will also accept cash.

**A LITTLE BIRDIE TOLD ME THAT** the Post Office Hotel at Chillagoe, is under brand new management, and 8 rooms available on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> June. To me that translates to "Trekkers booked the 8 rooms months ago, but the outgoing owners didn't pass the booking on to the incoming owners". If you think you have rooms booked at the Post Office Hotel Chillagoe, I suggest you check in with them ASAP.

**LONGEST FUEL DAY**. As you know, the longest fuel day is Karumba Point to Chillagoe, 568 kilometres. Second longest is Dubbo to Bourke, 488 kilometres.

**FLYING IN TO LONGREACH?** You can get your registrations pack from T10 at outwards control on the Thursday morning.

**WEDNESDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> JUNE IS A LAY DAY IN LONGREACH** – Longreach is a great town, with lots to see and do. There are multiple attractions, but regardless of the attraction you wish to see, you should book early. The town is full of Trekkers and Grey Nomads, and I suggest you book via the Longreach Visitor Centre on (07) 4658 4141 or have a look at http://www.experiencelongreach.com.au/

In my opinion the best attraction by a country mile is the QANTAS Museum. QANTAS were of course a fundamental part of the very early days of the RFDS, and their wonderful staff have put together a special (discounted) deal for the RFDS Trek. 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
