EFTPOS IN REMOTE LOCATIONS:

During COVID we have all got used to tap & pay for even the smallest purchases, but in remote locations there sometimes isn't any EFTPOS at all, or the internet is so patchy is switches off just as you are ordering your first beer of the evening. The most likely problem areas are marked in the book the day before to remind you to take cash but do everyone a favour and make sure you have cash in your pocket for raffle tickets and drinks, and maybe enough for a tank of fuel as well – just in case.

TELSTRA:

Telstra is the dominant source of connectivity in remote locations. If you are not a Telstra customer, and if staying in contact is important to you (including payments on your phone), you should look at grabbing a Telstra SIM card before you leave home.

VEHICLE SECURITY:

There is probably no politically correct way of saying this, and if there was I wouldn't use it. We are staying in (only) one or two towns where at night you need to make sure your cars are locked, and your valuables are secured......





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SUNSETS:

Spending eight nights on the coastline of the Indian Ocean means we are sure to see our fair share of great sunsets, but nothing, absolutely nothing, should be more spectacular that the sunset in Carnarvon. Think a Broome sunset on steroids.

Buses have been arranged to get you to the café at One Mile Jetty (aptly named Sunsets Café) in plenty of time to grab a beer, hold hands with your favourite Trekker, and be enthralled as the sun sets into the water. Dinner is here at Sunsets as well. The bus mud-map for pickups will be handed out at control.

THE GIBB RIVER ROAD:

I am reliably informed that the Gibb is now "like a billiard table". In 27 more sleeps we will find out.

ROACH-TAILS:

Our overnight stop on the Gibb River Road is at Mt Elizabeth Station. Leaving Broome that morning the Cockroaches will be selling an incredible little goodies pack that, amongst other items, includes a "roach-tail" glass (think cocktail). When you get to Mt Elizabeth you will enjoy an Anti-Pasto spread to die for, and some Roach-Tails. Enjoy, and every single cent of your \$100



per person goes to the RFDS. To help, on the Wednesday morning please have your \$100 note per person ready or hit the QR code above, or the road book and show your screen as "proof of purchase".

FUEL ON THE GIBB:

Is at Mount Barnett Roadhouse, about an hour before Mt Elizabeth. Everyone will need to fuel here, there is no fuel at Mt Elizabeth. Take note that Mount Barnett normally closes at 3:00 pm, however they will stay back for a while to serve us fuel. According to our schedule, last cars should be in Mount Barnett by around 3:30 pm so if you're running later than that you will need to contact them – the number is in the book.

KUNUNURRA DINNER:

At the Hotel Kununurra we will need to take dinner spread over two sittings – 5:30 & 7:30 pm. You will be given a wristband at control at Ellenbrae Station during the day to signify which sitting you are on. Please wear it so the staff know you are part of the Trek, and please be on time, it is an alternate drop meal.






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SOCIAL MEDIA:
